

BATTERIES AND ACCUMULATORS

RECYCLING

IN SPAIN

LEGISLATION:

- Directive 2006/66/EC

– Directive 2008/12/EC

ROYAL DECREE 106/2008, dated February 01, 2008 on batteries and accumulators and recycling of their waste. <u>It will be in force as from September 26, 2008 in Spain.</u>

Scope:

- Article 2 of Directive 2006/66/EC and batteries and accumulators which come from electric and electronic equipment (Directie 2002/95/EC) and end of life vehicles (Directives 2000/53/EC).

In addition, Royal Decree sets two types of batteries and accumulators waste:

- a) waste from batteries and accumulators
- b) Hazardeous waste from batteries and accumlators:
 - 16 06 01* batteries and accumulators with lead
 - 16 06 02* batteries and accumulatos wiht Ni-Cd
 - 16 06 03* batteries with mercury
 - 20 01 33* the above batteries and accumulators which come from private households, business and offices and similar locations

Prohibitions:

- Articule 4 of Directive 2006/66/EC

- Prohibitions established on the Royal Decree 1383/2002, on end of life vehicles

PRODUCER'S OBLIGACIONS:

Definition of producer: Article 3 (12) of the Directive 2006/66/EC

- MAIN OBLIGATION: producer should collect and recycle batteries and accumulators as of <u>September 26, 2008</u> by means of:
 - Paying recycling fees to collective schemes
 - Setting his/its on collective scheme
 - Joining a collective scheme
 - Setting a deposit, refund and return system
- To convey his/its condition of producer to Regional authorities and National Register

PRODUCER'S OBLIGACIONS:

- To convey to National Register weights of batteries and accumulators put on Spanish market quarterly
- Labbeling: to comply with article 21 Directive 2006/66/EC
 - Symbols shown in Annex II
 - Capacity of all portable and automotive batteries and accumulators as of September 26, 2009
